Refresh your spirit and creativity with the tranquil art of Navajo weaving in this workshop open to both beginners and experienced weavers. Barbara and Lynda, sisters and 5th generations weavers, are originally from Two Grey Hills, growing up learning the traditional tapestry weaving of that area. Barbara has won 2 Best of Show awards at the Santa Fe Indian Market and countless other weaving awards from various art shows, and Lynda has garnered 2 First Place Blue Ribbons at the Santa Fe Indian Market for her tapestries.

While instructing and demonstrating, Barbara and Lynda will share personal stories and experiences, giving participants fascinating insights into the world of Navajo weaving. The sisters are also a lot of fun and they promise that you will have a great time! And, you will go home with a 12.5" x 16.5" rug! An optional day for a workshop on warping your loom has been scheduled for Nov. 5.



DETAILS :The price for members staying at the Amerind for 5 days is \$1,000. This includes meals, lodging (shared accommodations), the use of a fully prepared loom, and tools and materials. You will only need to purchase some of your wool (available at the class, approximately \$25-\$35 depending on the number of colors you select). Fee with meals, but no lodging is \$850 for 5 days. Please add an additional \$225 (without lodging option, \$185) for the one-day warping workshop to cover instruction, supplies, and room and board. If you are not sure if you want to take the warping class you will be able to sign up during the week. The price of the weaving workshop includes a \$200 tax-deductible contribution to the Amerind.
